TUSD Invites Public to Community Open House Night at Foothill High School's New Science Center

The Tustin Unified School District is inviting the public to attend a Community Open House Night at Foothill High School's new state-of-the-art Science Center from 6 to 8 p.m. Monday, Nov. 30. The school is located at 19251 Dodge Ave.

"The new Science Center is a spectacular building that will enhance our science program and become a focal point on campus and throughout the Foothill school community," Principal Al Marzilli said.

The District held a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Foothill Science Center on Nov 5. Teachers will move in starting Nov. 12 and the first day for students will be Nov. 30.

The two-story facility is approximately 48,000 sq. ft. and features 14 high-tech classrooms, including biology, chemistry and physics labs; and earth science and physical science classrooms. There is also a staff office, conference room, rest rooms, storage rooms, a curved glass-block stairway enclosure, elevator and landscaped courtyard with curved planters that double as seating areas.

The building was designed by NTD Architecture and constructed by Barnhart-Heery. It is located adjacent to the staff parking lot on campus near Newport Ave. and Foothill Blvd.

The total cost of the project is approximately \$19 million, which is being funded through the Measure G campus modernization program. Measure G was passed in 2002 by the voters to repair and renovate the 20 oldest schools in the Tustin school district.
