Seniors! Are you wondering if your Cal Grant GPA has been received by the California Student Aid Commission (Cal Grant)? After you have filed a FAFSA or California Dream Act Application, you can go on-line and check the status of your Cal Grant application by logging on to [WebGrants for Students](#) and creating an account. This secure site provides you with resources, information and tools to assist you with the college financial aid process. It will also let you view the status of your Cal Grant or Chafee Grant application, update your address, submit corrections, view your payment history, update your college of attendance, or satisfy outstanding requirements.

Please note: When creating your WebGrants account, use your student Social Security number.
